Making History: LOCK RESTORATION CELEBRATION

Be sure reserve May 19, 2007 on your calendar. Plan to attend the "Open House" at Appleton lock #2 near 820 S. Olde Onieida St. to commemorate the completion of the repair of the four Appleton locks. That's right, the four Appleton locks are finished and you will be able to see them operate for the first time since they were closed almost 25 years ago! This event in collaboration with the Fox River Navigational System Authority, the City of Appleton, Riverside Paper Corp., The Appleton Sesquicentennial Committee, and CR Meyer Construction Company, is a Community Event that will commemorate the completion of the 2.2 million-dollar project to restore the four Appleton locks. The building of the original locks coincides with the Appleton Sesquicentennial also being celebrated this summer. Then, as now, the locks are a part of the economic development in the Fox Valley Region. This lock reconstruction project event will showcase this important aspect of Appleton's early history, providing greater positive exposure for the Fox River. The project will offer improved public access for outdoor enthusiasts; enhance public awareness of the river's history and the threat of invasive species and other water quality issues; and allow people to witness the beauty of nature while exploring enhanced recreational opportunities.

Here's what we have planned for you on that day:

The Expo Event is on the grounds adjacent to Appleton lock # 2 and will be open from 1 to 4 PM. Admission is FREE.

We have invited Governor Doyle and Appleton Mayor Hanna to cruise into the lock aboard the 65' paddle wheel vessel Seven Cs to declare that this part of the project is complete and to announce the start of the Appleton Sesquicentennial Celebration.

Ride aboard the 63' Lakeside Spirit excursion vessel from Fond du Lac, WI With Captain Jack and experience "locking through" the Appleton locks.

Browse exhibits of Riverfront Plans from communities up and down our Fox River Valley from Fond du Lac to Green Bay.

Visit the Kids Activity Area!

View Alex Nimphius' hand-built historic "voyager" canoe. Kids can put together little canoes and paint with magic markers. Food and refreshments will be available under the "big top" tent at Appleton lock # 2. (see maps)

A Word From Bob

Updated Lower Fox River Locks Construction Schedule

The Fox River Navigational System Authority (FRNSA) was created in 2001 by the State Legislature to facilitate the transfer and rehabilitation of the lower Fox River locks from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The FRNSA has a plan to complete all lock restoration projects by 2009 and to have the system in operation by 2010.

- In 2005,stabilization work was completed in Kaukauna and Little Chute locks.
- In 2006, an aquatic invasive species-monitoring program above and below the Rapid Croche Sea

Lamprey barrier was initiated. This program is under the direction of Dr, Bart De Stasio of Lawrence University in Appleton.

In 2006, the four Appleton locks were rebuilt and came in on time and under budget. The City of Appleton also replaced the

- Olde Oneida Street Bridge The Lawe Street Bridge and the CN Railroad Bridge at Appleton Lock #4 are being rebuilt in 2007.
- 2007, the Cedars Lock and the mile long dike through the Village of Little Chute will be rebuilt. Operation of the Appleton and Cedars section is scheduled for 2008 when the bridges will be completed.
- The Little Chute guard lock, lock and combined locks are scheduled for 2008.
- The five Kaukauna locks are scheduled for rehabilitation in 2009.

There are three financial pieces of the puzzle that still need to be completed

- A requirement of the original locks transfer agreement was that \$2.8 million needs to be raised locally to obtain state and federal matches. At this time, approximately \$600,000 of that amount remains to be raised;
- 2. The federal match still needs to be secured by action of the federal representatives.
- A plan for and funding to support the transfer of boats over the sealed Rapide Croche sea lamprey barrier must be approved.This plan, including an aquatic invasive species management element, is currently under development.

Local citizens and business owners interested in the project can participate and provide input by contacting the FRNSA at their headquarters in the Corps of Engineers Building, 1008 Augustine St, Kaukauna, WI 54130. Residents and businesses are encouraged to become members of the Friends of the Fox and support their fund-raising effort by donating to the "Unlock the Fox Locks Fund". The ultimate success of the project depends on citizens of the area, as this is not considered to be a government project; it is a local project to benefit the local folks in the Fox Valley Region. The slide show featured before and after pictures of lock restoration work as well as information on some proposed projects along the Fox River. An item that received much attention was the large board prepared by East Central Regional Planning Commission showing information on the location of all the locks between Menasha and Green Bay. 
